VENERABLE SERVANT OF GOD
ARCHBISHOP MAR IVANIOS OIC
(FOUNDER OF BETHANY ASHRAM)

The late Archbishop Venerable Servant of God Mar Ivanios OIC was born on 21st September 1882 at Mavelikara in Kerala. He was a multifaceted personality whose life touched all realms of society. His intense spiritual fervour and enlightenment led him and his followers to a monastic life inspired by the principles of Oriental and Indian religious life. After the initial preparation he moved to Mundanmala, near Perunadu, Ranni in Kerala and founded the Order of Imitation of Christ, also known as Bethany Ashram, on 15th August 1919. Within no time Bethany Ashram, with its beloved founder, was instrumental in creating a wave of spiritual renaissance in the Kerala Church. Along with his spiritual leadership, Mar Ivanios also played a colossal role in the social transformation of his motherland. His phenomenal works among the outcastes, downtrodden and women and in the field of healthcare and education manifest the pioneering role he had played as a social reformer. Noteworthy among his social reforms were the number of schools that he had established. A striking factor about these schools was that the majority of these institutions were established in remote areas. The results were dramatic. A large number of people from these areas became professors, civil servants etc. who in turn contributed their share in social transformation. The life and achievements of Mar Ivanios seems to be quite incredible. He achieved in his lifetime more than what two or three generations could achieve. He was certainly a true missionary with a vision, a man to mediate, a priest to imitate and a prophet to follow.

ORDER OF THE IMITATION OF CHRIST

BETHANY ASHRAM

The Order of the Imitation of Christ (OIC), also known as the Bethany Ashram, was founded by the Servant of God Archbishop Mar Ivanios OIC in the Malankara Syrian Orthodox Church on 15th August 1919 at Perunadu, near Ranni in Pathanamthitta District of Kerala. Bethany Ashram was the first monastic community in the Malankara church. It had a unique vision and mission. It harmoniously blends in its life the monastic ideals of the Christian East and Indian Sanyasa in a particular lifestyle that is actualized in intense prayer and apostolic activities. The name Bethany Ashram itself is a symbol of this. Simple and austere life, an atmosphere of intense prayer and solitude, saffron (kavi) habit, community life are some of the basic features of this lifestyle. Soon after its foundation, Bethany Ashram became a centre of spiritual solace for the Malankara church. In 1930 most of its members along with the founder embraced the communion of the Catholic Church. Thus, Bethany Ashram became the cradle of the historic Re-union Movement and the Malankara Catholic Church.

The early members were actively involved in building up the Malankara Catholic Church in the Catholic communion and undertook a wide range of apostolic activities. After the consolidation of the Malankara Catholic Church with an “All India Missionary Vision” bequeathed to Bethany Ashram by their beloved founder, the Ashram began to grow and branch out.

In 1966 the Congregation was raised to the Pontifical Status. On 24th April 2000 two provinces were erected in the Congregation: Bethany Navajeevan Province and Bethany Navjyothi Province.

CONVEYANCE

We encourage students to use public transport and bicycles to come to school.

If any changes in the conveyance...

1. Students not travelling by the bus or wish to travel by another bus on particular day/days have to get permission from the principal through request form with the cost of Rs.50/-
2. Any communication with regard to conveyance has to be brought to the office and not through the drivers and conductors.
3. Parents also make sure that their child knows what to do if he/she misses the bus - come back home or, if at school, report to a teacher - and never accept a ride from a stranger.

TO GET ON THE SCHOOL BUS

1. Students are provided to and fro conveyance by school bus. An application form has to be filled and submitted by parents who intend to use the bus services. The boarding point and other details have to be clearly mentioned in the application form.
2. The van fees will be charged according to the distance and it should be paid in two instalments. First, at the beginning of the first term, on or before first June and the second before 30th September.

Note: Students are not allowed to use (drive) two wheelers/four wheelers in school uniform without licence. If violated, it will be intimated to the police department.

COMMUTING BY BUS

1. It is the sole responsibility of the parent and the guardian to see that the ward is on time. The bus will not wait for the student.
2. Those students without proper uniform will not be allowed to board the bus.
3. Students are asked to enter and leave the bus in single line, with young children going first.
4. Students should remain quietly and safely seated at the allotted places while travelling until the bus arrives at its destination.

FEE REMITTANCE

ATTENDANCE

All students should have a minimum of 95% attendance to his/her credit in an academic year to be considered for promotion. Unauthorized absence for a period of 15 days and above will lead to the removal of the student's name from the rolls. Every absence, delay, permission, request, explanation and other exceptions must be entered in the forms which can be bought from the office at the cost of Rs. 5. Photocopies of the forms will not be accepted. No student will be sent home even if it is urgent, unless accompanied by a duly authorized person. In case of long leave (more than three days) due to illness, a medical certificate will have to be produced. Students, who are absent more than three days for reasons other than medical, will be asked to meet the Principal with the parents to be allowed in the class

TAKING LEAVE

1. Leave form should be collected from the office and submitted on the nextday in case of emergency leave but give it in advance for a planned leave.

INTERNAL ASSESSMENT

PERIODIC ASSESSMENT (05 MARKS)

The main purpose of Periodic Assessment is to assess the learning progress of students. Such Assessment done at regular intervals provides feedback and insight to teachers regarding learners' needs and helps them to improve instruction. Periodic Tests (05 marks): As earlier, these would be restricted to 4 in each subject in a year and the average of best 2 would to be taken for final submission of marks for Grade IX & X. From Grade I to VIII would be restricted to 2 in each subject in a term and the average of PT would to be taken for PA in term marks.

MULTIPLE ASSESSMENT (05 MARKS):

Subject teachers would determine the type and frequency. Schools/ teachers would be able to use multiple and diverse assessment techniques to assess learners, i.e., observation, oral tests, individual or group work, class discussion, field-work, concept maps, graphic organizers, visual representation etc. The context towards addressing the goal of assessment for and as learning, such as quizzes, project-work, self and peer assessment, collaborative projects, experiments, classroom demonstrations, etc. Subject teachers should assess the activities on the basis of rubrics.

PORTFOLIO (05 MARKS):

A portfolio is a collection of chosen work by a student representing a selection of performances. It is a tool for assessing a variety of skills not usually testable in pen paper test. Portfolio helps students gain an awareness of their own learning. Peer Assessment is a great support that facilitates a clear understanding and evaluation of personal goals. Assessing Portfolios Students' portfolio can be effectively evaluated using a simple scoring rubric. The criteria to be used in determining the quality of a particular student's portfolio needs to be carefully developed and shared with students.

SUBJECT ENRICHMENT ACTIVITIES (05 MARKS):

Subject enrichment activities aim at enrichment of the understanding and skill development of students in particular subjects. These enrichment activities need to challenge students and permit them to apply knowledge to the next level. For conducting these activities are as follows: Languages provide subject teachers to develop relevant listening and speaking skills. The specified activities in practical work in Science and Mathematics need to be conducted in congruence to the objectives of the subject and Social need to be provide project work. Students need to be encouraged to raise questions, generate hypotheses, experiment, innovate and find solutions to questions/ problems encountered.

CO – SCHOLASTIC AREAS:

According to the National Education Policy 2020 aims to overcome the social status hierarchy associated with vocational education and integration of vocational education into mainstream education in all educational institutions in a phased manner. In secondary classes Board offers variety of competency-based subjects under NSQF, in our school choose the Robotics, Artificial Intelligence & Information Technology.

ART EDUCATION

It entails instruction in various art forms with an aim to help children develop an interest for arts and encourage them to participate in related activities, thus, promoting abilities such as imagination, creativity, valuing arts and cultural heritage. Arts should be integrated with other subjects to promote creative thinking and expression. Exploring into ideas and meanings through the works of artists/experts/ writers/poets, the students would develop imagination and critical awareness. Students may select one form each from Visual Arts (drawing, painting, collages, and crafts) and Performing Arts (dance, music, drama).

HEALTH AND PHYSICAL EDUCATION

It focuses on holistic development, both mental and physical, understanding the importance of physical fitness, health, wellbeing and the factors that contribute to them. Focussing on of this area our school is providing indigenous sports, Yoga, NCC, and co – curricular activities.

Assessment of Art Education and Health and Physical Education may be continuously done by collecting information and documented data. The Report Card should reflect the interpretation of the teachers in the form of grades.

WORK EXPERIENCE

The Work Experience has been subsumed in the Health and Physical Education; however, it is an integral part of the curriculum and is given as much as focus as Health and Physical Education.

21st CENTURY SKILLS

There is an increased awareness among the educators of the need to integrate what are called as 21st Century skills in educational systems. There are three key 21st century skills; Learning Skills, Literacy Skills and Life Skills.

GENERAL RULES

Instructions to the Students:

- ❖ Students are expected to attend classes at school regularly and always be punctual. They have to enter the school premises at 8.40. Late arrival will be permitted between 8.41 - 8.45, only thrice in a month.
- ❖ Students entering late to the school campus are asked to collect Delay form from office and submit the completed form to the Class teacher..
- ❖ Students are asked to maintain a minimum of 95% attendance to be eligible to appear for the examination.
- ❖ Students who were absent the previous day must submit the leave form and get entry in the 'Record of Non-attendance' page of the student hand book without fail. In case of leave for more than three days, a Medical Certificate should also be submitted.
- ❖ Students are asked to wear the school identity card regularly.
- ❖ The uniform must be clean well pressed and complete at all times and it should conform to the standards laid down by the school.
- ❖ Boys are prohibited from coming to school in fancy hair styles, very low waist boot cut trousers, flashy belts and designer shoes.
- ❖ ID cards are to be worn by all students along with the uniform at all times in the school campus and in the school buses.
- ❖ Students who are not in proper uniform will not be permitted to sit in class and their parents will be asked to come to school and take back their wards.
- ❖ Students should wear uniform for special /extra classes and other occasions.
- ❖ Pupils of one class/section are not allowed to be in any of the class/section even during intervals.
- ❖ Students should place their belongings inside their bags if they are leaving the classroom.
- ❖ Students are supposed to wear the badges given by the school daily. Badges or ID cards if lost; a fine of Rs. 300 will be collected from the concerned students.
- ❖ Students can get Bonafide Certificate, Mark Sheet etc. once in a year free of cost. If they need the same for the second time they should pay a sum of Rs.50/-
- ❖ Students are not allowed to wear any gold ornaments, Trinket and Jewellery or apply henna or nail paint .Girls are allowed to wear only studs.
- ❖ Students till grade V are not allowed to wear watches. Students of grades above VI can use ordinary watches but not fancy watches and smart watches.

- ❖ Students have to bring their student handbook to school every day and write their study portions, then get the signature from the class teacher.
- ❖ Students should present themselves clean, well groomed and in properly laundered school uniforms.
- ❖ Students are responsible to wrap their school books neatly with brown paper and to properly name them.

Instructions to the Parents

- ❖ If the students come by private vehicle, parents are requested to drop and pick their wards up near the entrance and not to accompany them into the class rooms.

CANTEEN GUIDELINES

Regarding the usage of Canteen by Students

Upkeep of Cleanliness

- Consistent wiping of tables and cleaning the floor ought to be done during canteen working hour
- Reasonable cleanliness ought to be maintained by the cook and laborers before, during and after food serving time.
- There ought not be any flies or some other bugs in the cooking and serving region
- Dustbin ought to be put in the canteen premise so that waste stuff could be thrown. The dust bin should be emptied time to time.

Upkeep of Food Quality and Cleanliness

- Eating/Drinking is not permitted in the cooking region of the flask. Just cleanly stuffed and confirmed food wares (Agmark/FSSAI) are to be utilized for cooking.

- Wash serving utensils fully and thoroughly.
- Incline toward air drying of utensils, try not to wipe with unwashed clothes .
- Wash/disinfect hands when serving food.
- Wear mask and gloves while serving food.

- ❖ Boiled eggs
- ❖ Raisin or fruit bread
- ❖ hot pastries like sausage rolls and pies
- ❖ cakes, slices, croissants and sweet breads like donuts
